Preparation

The *TOEFL* is a standardized test that measures the English language ability of non-native speakers looking to enroll in an English-speaking university or program. The test is made up of four components: reading, listening, speaking, and writing.

The minimum recommended time to begin studying for the TOEFL is **eight weeks** before your exam date, although preparation even before that could be beneficial to students looking to achieve a high score.

Comprised of multiple-choice questions, the TOEFL ITP Level 1 and Level 2 tests evaluate skills in 3 areas:

- **Listening Comprehension** measures the ability to understand spoken English as it is used in colleges and universities.
- **Structure and Written Expression** measures recognition of selected structural and grammatical points in standard written English.
- **Reading Comprehension** measures the ability to read and understand academic reading material written in English.

CEFR Mapping Study

Results of the CEFR mapping provide the minimum TOEFL ITP section scores for 4 of the levels defined in the **CEFR (A2, B1, B2 and C1)**.

The table below shows the scaled cut scores for each section of the TOEFL ITP Level 1 and Level 2 tests.

The TOEFL ITP® test takes 1 hour and 55 minutes to complete and includes 3 sections:

- Listening Comprehension: 35 minutes
- Structure and Written Expression: 25 minutes
- Reading Comprehension: 55 minutes

Before the test, 30 minutes are required to complete administrative formalities

Here is an example.

On the recording, you hear:

(Woman) I don't like this painting very much. (Man) Neither do I.

(Narrator) What does the man mean?

On the screen, you read:

- A. *He does not like the painting either.*
- B. *He does not know how to paint.*
- C. *He does not have any paintings.*
- D. *He does not know what to do.*

You learn from the conversation that neither the man nor the woman likes the painting. The

best answer to the question "What does the man mean?" is A, "He does not like the painting either." Therefore, the correct choice is A.

On the recording, you hear:

(Narrator) Listen to an instructor talk to his class about a television program.

(Man) I'd like to tell you about an interesting TV program that'll be shown this coming Thursday. It'll be on from 9 to 10 P.M., on Channel 4. It's part of a series called Mysteries of Human Biology. The subject of the program is the human brain—how it functions and how it can malfunction. Topics that will be covered are dreams, memory, and depression. These topics are illustrated with outstanding computer animation that makes the explanations easy to follow. Make an effort to see this show. Since we've been studying the nervous system in class, I know you'll find it very helpful.

Now listen to a sample question.

(Narrator) What is the main purpose of the program?

On the screen, you read:

- A. To demonstrate the latest use of computer graphics
- B. To discuss the possibility of an economic depression
- C. To explain the workings of the brain
- D. To dramatize a famous mystery story

The best answer to the question "What is the main purpose of the program?" is C, "To explain the workings of the brain." Therefore, the correct choice is answer C.

Now listen to another sample question.

(Narrator) Why does the professor recommend watching the program?

On the screen, you read:

- A. It is required of all science majors.
- B. It will feature the professor's research.
- C. It can help viewers improve their memory skills.
- D. It will help with course work.

The best answer to the question "Why does the speaker recommend watching the program?" is D, "It will help with course work." Therefore, the correct choice is answer D.

During the early period of ocean navigation, _____ any need for sophisticated instruments and techniques.

- A. so that hardly
- B. when there hardly was
- C. hardly was
- D. there was hardly

The sentence should read, "During the early period of ocean navigation, **there was hardly** any need for sophisticated instruments and techniques." Therefore, you should choose D.

For as long as merchants have set out their wares at daybreak and communal festivities have been celebrated, people have been in rough agreement with their neighbors as to the time of day. The value of this tradition is today more apparent than ever. Were it not for public acceptance of a single yardstick of time, social life would be unbearably chaotic: the massive daily transfers of goods, services, and information would proceed in fits and starts; the very fabric of modern society would begin to unravel.

1. What is the main idea of the passage?
 - A. In modern society we must make more time for our neighbors.
 - B. The traditions of society are timeless.
 - C. An accepted way of measuring time is essential for the smooth functioning of society.
 - D. Society judges people by the times at which they conduct certain activities.

The main idea of the passage is that societies need to agree about how time is measured in order to function smoothly. Therefore, you should choose answer C.

2. In line 7, the phrase "this tradition" refers to
 - A. the practice of starting the business day at dawn
 - B. friendly relations between neighbors
 - C. the railroad's reliance on time schedules
 - D. people's agreement on the measurement of time

The phrase "this tradition" refers to the preceding clause, "people have been in rough

agreement with their neighbors as to the time of day." Therefore, you should choose answer D.
